

# Executive Summary of Damage and Loss

## Event Overview

On June 10, 2024, a severe tropical cyclone affected the central coastal region, leading to significant damages across infrastructure, residential, and commercial areas. The disaster resulted in widespread disruption of essential services, impacting over 250,000 residents.

## Key Damages

- Infrastructure: Major bridges and roadways were washed out, leading to loss of connectivity for five major towns.
- Housing: Approximately 18,000 homes were either partially or completely destroyed.
- Public Services: Health facilities and schools reported substantive structural damage, impeding their operations.
