## PURPOSE OF OBSERVATION

To assess the level of compliance with internal controls and regulatory requirements in daily operations, focused on the Consignment Handling Protocols.

## OBSERVATION SUMMARY

All procedures for recording consignment receipts and dispatches were followed, but temporary storage areas were not consistently labeled, and several transfer logs were incomplete.

## DETAILS OF OBSERVATIONS

## RECOMMENDATIONS

- Ensure all temporary storage racks are visibly labeled at all times.
- Mandate the immediate completion and dual-signature of consignment transfer logs.
- Conduct periodic internal audits for consistent compliance monitoring.

## FOLLOW-UP ACTIONS

- Training session on consignment handling scheduled for 2024-06-18.
- Responsible party: Operations Supervisor
- Review period: 2 weeks
