

Qualitative Findings Summary

Purpose

This summary presents key themes that emerged from recent qualitative interviews conducted to understand user experiences with the new online self-service portal. Insights are organized based on participant feedback and categorized according to recurring topics and concerns.

Key Themes and Illustrative Quotes

1. Usability and Navigation

- Most participants found the interface intuitive but noted difficulties in accessing help resources.
- Feedback also indicated a need for clearer labeling of menu items.

2. Visual Design and Clarity

- Respondents appreciated the clean look of the portal.

3. Account Management Functions

- Several commented positively on the ease of updating personal information.
- Confusion was reported regarding multi-step authentication during login.
â€œChanging my address was really easy, but I was not sure why I had to verify twice.â€

4. Suggestions for Improvement

- Participants recommended a step-by-step introduction for first-time users.
- Some suggested a more prominent FAQ or help section accessible from the main dashboard.
â€œA short tutorial when you first log in would help a lot.â€

Conclusion

The feedback highlights broad satisfaction with the platform's basic functions and aesthetics, while pointing to opportunities to enhance support resources, readability, and guided onboarding. These insights should inform ongoing improvements to maximize user satisfaction and accessibility.
