- **frequency** field defines the recurrence interval (e.g., monthly, weekly, yearly).
- **recurrence\_start** and **recurrence\_end** indicate the period for automated invoice generation.
- **next\_invoice\_date** helps track when the next invoice will be issued.
- All standard invoice details can be included, with extra fields for managing recurrence.
- This format enables clear automation for billing systems and transparency for clients.
