

Broad Form Indemnity Agreement

This Broad Form Indemnity Agreement (â€œAgreementâ€) is made and entered into on this _____ day of _____, 20_____, by and between:

1. Indemnity

To the fullest extent permitted by law, the Indemnitor agrees to indemnify, hold harmless, and defend the Indemnitee, its officers, directors, employees, and agents from and against any and all claims, damages, losses, expenses (including attorneyâ€™s fees), liabilities, and causes of action arising out of, related to, or resulting from the performance of work under this Agreement, regardless of whether such claim, damage, loss, or expense is caused in part by the Indemnitee.

2. Scope

This indemnity shall apply to any and all claims for bodily injury, death, property damage, or economic loss, whether such claims are made by employees of the Indemnitor, the Indemnitee, or any third party.

3. Exclusions

Notwithstanding the foregoing, this Agreement does not require the Indemnitor to indemnify the Indemnitee for damages or injuries proven to be caused by the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the Indemnitee.

4. Defense

The Indemnitor shall, at its own cost and expense, defend any suit, action, or proceeding that may be brought against the Indemnitee on any such claim, and shall pay any judgment, costs, and expenses incurred by the Indemnitee.

5. Term

This Agreement shall survive the completion of the work and shall remain in full force and effect as to any claim, action, or liability arising from work performed under this Agreement.

Important Notes:

- Broad Form Indemnity may shift liability to the contractor even if the owner is partially at fault.
