

Standard Mutual Release Agreement

Clause-by-Clause Breakdown

1. Parties

Identifies the individuals or entities entering into the mutual release agreement, including their names and contact details.

2. Recitals (Background)

3. Mutual Release of Claims

9. Execution

Details regarding how the agreement is to be signed (e.g., counterpart execution, date, electronic signatures).
