

Standard Limited Liability Statement for Service Providers

This Limited Liability Statement ("Statement") is made as part of the agreement between the Service Provider and the Client ("Parties") concerning the provision of services as described in the relevant Service Agreement ("Agreement").

1. Limitation of Liability

To the maximum extent permitted by law, the Service Provider shall not be liable to the Client or any third party for any indirect, incidental, special, consequential, or punitive damages whatsoever arising out of or relating to the services provided, including but not limited to, loss of use, loss of data, lost profits or business interruption, even if advised of the possibility of such damages.

2. Maximum Aggregate Liability

The total aggregate liability of the Service Provider for any claim arising from or relating to this Agreement, whether in contract, tort, or otherwise, shall not exceed the total amount paid by the Client for services rendered during the twelve (12) months preceding the event giving rise to such liability.

3. Exclusions

The limitations set forth herein do not apply to claims resulting from gross negligence, willful misconduct, or to the extent prohibited by applicable law.

4. Indemnity

The Client agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the Service Provider from and against any and all claims, losses, liabilities, costs, and expenses arising from the Client's misuse of the services or violation of applicable laws.

5. Governing Law

This Statement shall be governed by, and construed in accordance with, the laws of the jurisdiction as set out in the Agreement.
