STAR Format Sample

SITUATION

During my second year at university, I noticed a significant drop in academic performance among new students in my computer science department. Many of them expressed difficulty understanding basic programming concepts, which put them at risk of failing their first major course.

TASK

As an active member of the university's tech club, I felt a responsibility to address this issue and help my peers succeed. I took the initiative to design a peer tutoring program aimed at supporting first-year students struggling with programming fundamentals.

ACTION

I collaborated with faculty and fellow club members to create weekly tutorial sessions, recruited skilled volunteers, and developed easy-to-understand learning materials. I also conducted one-on-one mentoring, regularly collected feedback, and adjusted our approach based on students' progress and suggestions.

RESULT

By the end of the semester, participation in the tutorial program grew by 60%.
