## CSV Structure

## Important Notes

- The above CSV format supports a single line item per row. For multi-line invoices, repeat invoice header fields with new item details in subsequent rows.
- Ensure all required columns are present for successful mapping and conversion to UBL (Universal Business Language) format.
- Values such as date and decimal numbers should use consistent, standard formats (e.g., "YYYY-MM-DD", dot for decimals).
- Currency code must follow ISO 4217 standards (e.g., SAR, USD, EUR).
- UBL conversion and validation tools may impose additional constraints, such as mandatory fields and value checks.
